


Figure 2 Geographical distribution of Editorial Board members (updated on 09 January, 2019).




Figure 3 Geographical distribution of Corresponding Authors in 2018.




Figure 4 Citation of *Cardiovascular Diagnosis and Therapy*'s articles indexed by Web of Science Core Collection (Data were collected from Web of Science Core Collection on Jan. 09, 2019).




Figure 5 Retrieval of *Cardiovascular Diagnosis and Therapy* in PubMed is increasing (Data were collected from PMC Publisher Services on Jan. 09, 2019).
