As a first-class specialized hospital in China, it has achieved many "first" titles in its history: in terms of surgical techniques, it has carried out the nation's first instance of unrelated donor unilateral lobar lung transplantation on adult, the nation's first aortic valve replacement with coronary artery bypass, the nation's first tracheal resection and reconstruction, and the nation's first robot-assisted lobectomy, esophagectomy, and thymectomy. Despite its limited history, it has profound foundation congregating our nation's most excellent resources in cardiothoracic surgery.
