The author submitted an interesting narrative review of surgical techniques developed to identify the intersegmental plane during mini-invasive segmentectomy.

This work allows a quick and critical overview of the different techniques available in the field and we have to congratulate authors for their concision.

I have only minor comments:

1/ The article is short, which in my opinion is one of its qualities, but I would suggest adding to it if possible, a table classifying the literature according to the different techniques described. it would be very useful to the reader

2/ It seems important to me to emphasize that the technique of spotting the intersegmental plane alone cannot "improve oncological quality". In reality, it is the preoperative planning carried out by 3D for example and the margin that we choose to accept as recalled in the discussion that determines the oncological quality. For me, the role of locating the intersegmental plan is to approach the preoperative planning as closely as possible during the operation.

Our group demonstrate how 3D software can differently delineate the intersegmental plane according to the bronchus, vein or artery. It will therefore be important to adapt intraoperative technique to the planning carried out.
