This is an interesting case report showing that amyloidosis can initially present as hematochezia. This is indeed a notion that merits to be known! The discussion on amyloidosis (from pathogenesis to treatment) is complete.

### Reviewer B

This is a well written case and interesting case report describing a patient who present with hematochezia and abdominal pain and was ultimately found to have systemic AL amyloidosis with colonic and kidney involvement. The manuscript merits publication with the following suggested revisions.

1) The authors write: "The patient was transferred to the Hematology ward for treatment. She was administered chemotherapy with bortezomib and dexamethasone for four cycles with no significant adverse reaction. " This is somewhat vague; was she treated with bortezomib and dexamethasone alone or with chemotherapy? If she received chemotherapy, which drug? I assume it was most likely CyBorD. Please state clearly what treatment regimen she received by either naming the chemotherapy drugs she received or stating that she only received bortezomib and dexamethasone.

**Reply:** Thanks for your suggestion. The patient only received bortezomib and dexamethasone for four cycles.

**Changes in the text:** We have modified our text as advised (see Page 5, line 93).

2) To the extent the authors are able, it would be interesting to know a little bit more about what happened after treatment and after she received her follow up colonoscopy. Is she planned or did she receive a stem cell transplant? Are additional chemotherapy regimens planned? Why or why not?

**Reply:** The patient didn't receive further stem cell transplant or additional chemotherapy regimens considering her age, organ function and family economy.
