However, upon further reading the manuscript, it seems the authors are also suggesting optimization of the MCH. I feel the title should reflect this aspect as well.

2. Figure 1. In step 3, it is mentioned patients are divided into 2 groups: with and without chronic conditions.

Please help me understand as the healthcare management for COVID-19 does differ by region (country), is the author trying to imply on the risk factors that could lead to COVID-19 progression? Or based on the regional guidelines it is limited to only chronic conditions.

Additionally, since figure 1 is mentioned in the optimization section, is figure 1 suggesting optimization or the current working process? if it is suggesting the latter, i would recommend to change the title of the figure and highlight the optimization strategies in the figure.

A2: Thanks for your good suggestion. We have added the following information in the manuscript.

Page 3-4, line 65-71: Patients with asymptomatic or mild COVID-19 symptoms should be divided into two groups based on the presence of chronic disease, because it is an independent risk factor for COVID-19 progression. Those without chronic disease are prioritized for medical observation, expecting negative results on nucleic acid testing. For those with chronic illness, standardized treatment should be provided, and more attention should be paid to changes in symptoms.

Page 6, line 135: The title of figure 1 has been changed to "Optimization strategies of working
