JGO is the 12th journal of AME Publishing Company included by SCIE, following the other eleven sister journals:



Moreover, there are still our reviewers and readers worldwide that we could not express our appreciation one by one.



Figure 2 Geographical distribution of *Journal of Gastrointestinal Oncology's* corresponding authors in 2018 (updated in December 2018).




Figure 3 Number of published articles (updated in December 2018).




Figure 4 Citation of *Journal of Gastrointestinal Oncology* articles by articles indexed in Web of Science Core Collection (data were collected from Web of Science Core Collection in December 2018).




Figure 5 Retrieval of *Journal of Gastrointestinal Oncology* in PubMed is increasing and it also presents the growing readers of *Journal of Gastrointestinal Oncology* (data were collected from PMC Publisher Services in December 2018).
