Presidential address focused on learning and teams

In speech of Dr. Thoralf M. Sundt II, he emphasized that learning is the core of the team development and of dealing the complex worlds. We are living in a complex, unpredictable world, relying on individual knowledge and authority is no longer sufficient.

"In order to maximize success, we have to pay more attention to diversity in a team". He said. "Because diversity increases the chances of finding the best good solution."

"Enhance the collaboration and interaction of our team is completely within our power. No hospital committee or departmental approval is required. Even though you cannot solve all of the problems, you do have an enormous impact on those individuals around you."

As the leader of a team, "everyone is watching you." he added.

Dr. Sundt concluded by suggesting that it is very important to confront inevitable failure as a learning experience. "Trust your team—you need them. The patient needs them." he said (*Figure 1*).




Figure 7 Communication in the booth. (A) and (B) AME groups introducing the company and the books to experts who come to our booth; (C) Dr. David Jones from MSKCC (second from left); Dr. Jianxing He (second from right) are meeting with CEO of AME, Mr. Stephen Wang (first from the right).




Figure 9 One of the scene of the booth.




Figure 13 AME groups present certificates to our editorial board members. (A) Dr. Mark W. Onaitis from UC San Diego Health, Editorin-chief of *VATS*; (B) Dr. Mario Gaudino from Weill Cornell Medicine, editorial board member of *JTD*; (C) Dr. Hiroyuki Oizumi, from Yamagata University, editorial board member of *JOVS*.




Figure 19 Group photos. (A) Dr. K. Robert Shen and Mr. Stephen Wang; (B) Dr. Diego Gonzalez-Rivas; (C) Mr. Stephen Wang (first from left), Dr. David Jones (second from left), Prof. Jianxing He (first from right).
