Founded in 1993, ESTS is a professional association of thoracic surgeons in Europe. It aims to improve quality in all aspects of our specialty—from clinical and surgical management of patients to education, training and credentialing of thoracic surgeons in Europe and worldwide. So far, there are more than 1,200 members coming from 70 different countries all over the world.

Postgraduate Symposium—Master Cup

On May 28, the 25th European Society of Thoracic Surgeons (ESTS) was beginning with the Postgraduate Symposium on General Thoracic Surgery.

This is the 7th Postgraduate Symposium on General Thoracic Surgery among the thoracic surgeons from several continents. This Symposium is distinctive and brilliant, which has become one of the most attractive events in ESTS meeting.

The Master Cup Challenge in this year is different from the past ones. The participants were grouped by state, instead of continent. Professor Lanjun Zhang from Department of Thoracic Surgery, Sun Yat-sen University

Cancer Hospital is the team leader of China team. Team members are Fan Zhang from Chinese Academy of Medical Sciences Cancer Hospital, Runsen Jin from Shanghai Ruijin Hospital, Qiuyuan Li from Shanghai Pulmonary Hospital. These four team members were selected from there competitive competitions which were planned by Professor Alan Sihoe, one of the chairmen of this Symposium and AME publishing company (*Figure 1*).






Figure 19 *JTD* focused issue, the 4th edition of European Perspective of Thoracic Surgery, dedicated to the ESTS 2017.




Figure 21 At the AME Exhibit Booth, attendees were interested in the journals and books. (A) Dr. Alan D. L. Sihoe and Dr. Fernando Vannucci; (B) Dr. Joel Dunning and Dr. Diego Gonzalez Rivas; (C) communication among the surgeons.




Figure 23 Professors and AME. (A) Prof. Ramon Tami-Porta, Chair of the IASLC Staging and Prognostic Factors Committee, taking photo with AME editor Grace Li; (B) Dr. Bo Laksáfoss Holbe (Copenhagen University Hospital, Rigshospitalet) taking photo with AME editor Grace Li; (C) Dr. Christopher Seder and AME editor Macy Liu; (D) from left to right, Luca Bertolaccini, MD, PhD, AME editor Jessie and Piergiorgio Solli, MD (Papworth Hospital NHS Foundation Trust); (E) Gilbert Massard, MD, French team leader in the Postgraduate Course Master's Cup Competition of the ESTS 2017, President Elect ESTS, taking photo with AME editors; (F) Prof. Dominique Gossot, (Institute Mutualiste Montsouris, France), was issued a certificate as an editorial board member of *Video-Assisted Thoracic Surgery* journal by AME editor.
