## **Reviewer Comments**

This article presents the report of a patient who developed chylothorax 38 months after treatment with dasatinib for chronic myeloid leukemia. The patient's condition did not improve with discontinuation of dasatinib or the use of diuretics, steroids, or octreotide, but improved with fasting.

The authors reviewed 13 previously reported cases of dasatinib-induced chylothorax and reported that chylothorax generally occurred 16.5 months after starting dasatinib, improved in 10 patients after dasatinib was discontinued, and flared up in 2 patients after dasatinib was restarted. The authors emphasized the use of fasting as a treatment method, in addition to drug discontinuation and the use of steroids and diuretics.

The contents of the article are reasonable and suitable for publication.

Please consider the following minor modifications.

Comment 1: Page 1, line 15: What does CNKI stand for?

**Reply 1:** CNKI is the abbreviation of China national knowledge infrastructure.

**Comment 2:** Page 1, line 18: What does CAARE stand for?
