Reviewer A

In line 17-18, is it necessary to add the date i.e., May 17, 2023? If so, the sentence seems a bit unclear.

Reply: Because we need to specify the number of papers identified, it is necessary to add the date. According to your comments, this sentence has been modified.

I think the manuscript needs some editing for grammatical accuracy. For example, in line 17, 'the' may be used with 'English language'.

Reply: The language has been improved according to your comments.

There is a lack of coherence in the argument. For example, the author begins with the argument relating to how the word 'literatures' has appeared in scholarly papers and then end up talking about the quality of journals in terms of impact factors and cite score. The author should stick to the primary argument and elaborate on it further for clarity.

Reply: The presence of language mistakes in a published paper indicates poor quality of a journal. Indeed, we are writing this short paper to demonstrate this unexpected phenomenon, and then deeply analyze its potential reason that the journal is of poor quality.

I think reference format is not properly followed. Please, check with the journal's referencing style.

Reply: In the reference list, only websites or links are cited, but not traditional references. Indeed, this citation format is widely used in peer-reviewed journals.
