1	Would you like to share data collected for your study to others?	No
2	If not, would you like to share the reason for your decision?	We cannot share the single mortality data due to the existing rules on data privacy for such sensitive data. They are given officially in the nameless form to ENEA by the National Institute of Statistics (ISTAT), only for carrying out specific epidemiological studies. However, they could be requested directly from ISTAT, which is the responsible agency for collection and codification of death certificates in Italy.
3	What data in particular will be shared?	We can share the epidemiological indices computed for the present study such as SMRates, ASpMRates, RR or results from trend analyses.
4	Any other documents will be share? Such as study protocol, statistical analysis plan, informed consent form, clinical study report, analytic code.	Yes
5	When will data availability begin?	From the publication date of the article.
6	When will data availability end?	Two years within the publication date. The technological advances and substitution of the personal computers where such data are stored could not be compatible with longer times.
7	To whom will you share the data?	To public researchers and/or public health administrators.
8	For what type of analysis or purpose?	Epidemiological analyses or activities related to public health protection.
