



All together 40 members from 14 countries/regions.


Among them, 35% are from Italy and 15% are from USA.

For the future development of the journal, LS will be a quarterly journal starting from 2020.



In 2019, LS published **59 articles**, among which there are **13** Original Articles, Review Articles, and Case Reports.



8. Website Visits in 2019




In 2019, LS had **7,583** website visitors with **32,669** pageviews. The majority of our readers are from USA, followed by China and Japan.
