

4. Geographic Distribution of Editorial Board Members






In 2021, LS published **52 articles**, among which there are **42** Original Articles, Review Articles, and Case Reports.


In 2021, LS had **18,227** website visitors with **50,776** pageviews. The majority of our readers are from USA, followed by India and UK.
