



ccts has built an internationalized editorial board of 130 members. The largest proportion of editorial board members was from USA (43%), followed by Japan (12%), Italy (9%), UK (6%), etc.





Of the 43 articles published in 2021, the majority was Review Article (42%), followed by Case Report (23%), Editorial (Commentary) (19%), Surgical Technique (9%), and Original Article (7%).





A total of 43 corresponding authors were identified in 2021. A quarter of the corresponding authors were from Italy, followed by USA (21%), China (14%), Canada (7%), Japan (7%), Switzerland (5%), Spain (5%), etc.



Website pageviews have continued to increase from 2019 to 2021.




