












3. Distribution of Editorial Board Members




4. The Number of Published Articles in 2019 (results by month)

5. Diverse Types of Articles Published in 2019









Remote cerebellar hemorrhage with acute hydrocephalus after supratentorial surgery



Pulmonary infection caused by Aspergillus glaucus in patient with leucocythemia


