
2. Aims and Features

3. Geographic Distribution of Editorial Board Members





4. Diverse Types of Articles Published in 2023




In 2022, JOVS published 51 articles, among which there are 22 Case Report, and 14 Surgical Technique.





5. International Diversity of Corresponding Authors in 2023




Corresponding authors of 51 articles published in 2023 came from 19 countries, mostly from USA, Belgium, and UK.


