



#### 5. Distribution of Editorial Board Members




APM has **78** Editorial Board Members from **18** countries. Among them, 49% from USA, 12% from Canada, 10% from China.


#### 6. Number of Published Articles (results by year)

#### 7. Diverse Types of Articles Published in 2020




During 2020, APM has published 554 manuscripts, among which there are 45 Review Articles and 398 Original Articles.

## 8. International Diversity of Corresponding Authors in 2020




Corresponding authors of **554** articles published in 2020 come from **25** countries.






