




1. General Information of the Journal



CCTS's editorial board consists of 80 members from 12 countries, with the majority from the USA (59%).










4. Published Articles by Year



From 2019 to 2024, a total of 237 articles were published.



In 2024, CCTS published 34 articles, covering different categories as illustrated in the figure (left).



A total of 34 corresponding authors from 9 countries were identified in 2024, with the majority from the USA (56%).




